MEMORANDUM FOR All Persons Entering or Operating Motor Vehicles on an Arkansas National Guard Military Reservation

SUBJECT: The Adjutant General's Policy No. 2024-05, Inspection of Vehicles Entering or Exiting Arkansas National Guard Military Reservations

1. References:

2. Effective Date. This policy supersedes The Adjutant General's Policy No. 2021-24, Inspection of Vehicles Entering or Exiting Arkansas National Guard Military Reservations, dated 1 September 2021.

3. Purpose. This policy establishes and implements a program for the inspection of vehicles entering or exiting Camp Joseph T. Robinson Maneuver Training Center (RMTTC), Fort Chaffee Joint Maneuver Training Center (FCJMTC), and Ebbing Air Force

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Base. It is my responsibility as the designated custodian to ensure force protection and the security of military reservations under my control. Through this policy, I am implementing additional force protection steps to ensure the safety and security of Arkansas National Guard military and civilian personnel.

4. Applicability. This policy applies to all persons entering or operating motor vehicles on a military reservation, as the term is defined under Ark. Code Ann. § 12- 63-201.

5. Policy. In order to enhance installation security, random inspections may be conducted by authorized personnel on all vehicles, including any and all attachments, such as trailers, entering and exiting RMTC, FCJMTC, and Ebbing Air Force Base as outlined in this policy, applicable Arkansas Department of the Military policies, or in accordance with state and federal laws.

a. The State Security Specialist shall establish the minimum percentage of required vehicle inspections, which may change as often as needed to reasonably ensure operational security. Military Reservation Commanders may inspect a higher percentage of vehicles, so long as there remains an identifiable percentage basis over an identifiable time. The State Security Specialist shall ensure usage of Enclosure 1, or a similar documented system, to establish the minimum percentage of inspected vehicle.

b. Upon reasonable suspicion that a vehicle, its occupants, or its contents, pose a genuine threat to the safety and security of persons or a threat of damage to or destruction of property, a search may be performed. "Reasonable suspicion", as used in this paragraph, means a reasonable, articulable belief that the vehicle or person(s) to be searched contains unauthorized instruments of violence (e.g., bombs or bomb-making materials, firearms, ammunition, or chemical agents) or has demonstrated hostile intent to military and civilian personnel on the installation.

c. This policy does not limit the authority or ability of appropriate military authorities to conduct searches and seizures in accordance with applicable law. For example, exigent searches, or searches made with explicit or implicit consent remain lawful under this policy.

d. "Authorized personnel" means installation law enforcement officers, security guards, and military police or security forces assigned to the installation tasked with performing duties consistent with this policy.

6. Exemptions. Vehicles traveling in scheduled military convoys may be exempt from percentage basis inspections.


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7. Actions Upon Discovering Threat. In order to protect installation security, Arkansas National Guard military and civilian personnel working an access point at a military reservation are ordered to avert or mitigate any threat they discover, detain all persons posing a threat, and to immediately call for local law enforcement assistance. Unless otherwise directed, personnel are not authorized to pursue suspects on foot or by vehicle.
